The **Farnum House (31 Concord Street, Photos 86)**, built ca. 1865-1870 for Joseph Farnum, the other co-owner of the *Transcript*, is a well-preserved distinctive large end house example set on a granite foundation that combines Italianate and Queen Anne decorative detailing (the latter possibly a later alteration) and additional massing. A square bay on the façade and cross-gable bays with square bays on each side elevation augment the T-shaped main block, along with a two-story rear ell. Original period detail includes paired brackets on the corners and supporting the window and door lintels, a double-leaf entry door, original sash with decoratively arranged square lights (likely added in the early twentieth century), and decorative shingles, scroll sawed verge boards, and trusses in the cross gables.
