**ARTICLE I
Code Enforcement Officer
[Adopted by ATM 3-12-1963 as Art. 20;
amended by ATM 3-12-1968 by Art. 20]**

§30-1. Position created; duties.

The town creates the position of Building Inspector¹, whose duties shall be to inspect all construction for which a building permit has been applied for, conduct periodic inspections of the town to see that all ordinances are being complied with, notify the Selectmen of all violations and issue building permits.

§ 30-2. Appointment; salary.

The Selectmen shall annually appoint the Building Inspector and determine his salary.

**ARTICLE II
Town Administrator
[Adopted by ATM 3-14-1967 as Art 7]**

§ 30-3. Manner of selection.

The town authorizes the Selectmen to appoint the Highway Agent² at the next Town Meeting, March 12, 1968, instead of by ballot.

**ARTICLE III
Clerk and Treasurer
[Adopted by ATM 3-10-1981 as Art. 3]**

§ 30-4. Terms of office.

The town shall elect the Town Clerk and the Town Treasurer for three-year terms, as provided by RSA 41:16-b and RSA 41:26-b.

ARTICLE IV

Overseer of Public Welfare

[Adopted by ATM 3-17-1990 as Art. 26]

§ 30-5. Manner of selection.

The town authorizes the Selectmen to appoint the Overseer of Public Welfare, commencing with the conclusion of the 1991 Town Meeting, rather than the town electing the same.
