ARTICLE I
General Provisions

§ 195-1 Definitions.

For the purpose of these regulations, the words and phrases used herein shall have the following meanings, except in those instances where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- **COMPACT PART OF THE TOWN** - Includes Main Street, Depot Street, School Street, Vine Street, River Street, Winter Street, Vale Street, Bridge Street, Central Street, Laurel Street, Scott Street, Prospect Street, Cheney Avenue, Lookout Hill Road, Orchard Hill Road, Kaufman Drive, Nubanusit Lane, Grove Street to Noone's Mill, Granite Street to Wilton Road, Pine Street to Wilton Road, Concord Street to Sand Hill Road, Elm Street to Old Dublin Road, Union Street to west end of playground, High Street to MacDowell Colony, Summer Street to Woodmere Apartments, Old Dublin Road to Elm Street, Route 202 S to south end of the Shopping Village, and Route 101 from Old Street Road westerly to Elm Street.
- **CROSSWALK** - That portion of a roadway ordinarily included within the prolongation or connection of curb lines and property lines at intersections, or at any portion of a roadway clearly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines on the road surface or by other markings or signs.
- **EMERGENCY VEHICLES** - Vehicles of the Fire Department (fire patrol), Police Department or public or private ambulances and vehicles of law enforcement officers or voluntary members of the Fire Department when the latter are responding to an emergency in relation to the Police or Fire Department.
- **LANE** - A longitudinal division of a roadway into a strip of sufficient width to accommodate the passage of a single line of vehicles.
- **OFFICER** - Any officer or constable authorized to make arrest or serve process.
- **OFFICIAL TRAFFIC SIGNS** - All signs, markings and devices other than signals, not inconsistent with these regulations and which conform to the standards prescribed by the New Hampshire Highway Department and placed or erected by authority or a public body or official having jurisdiction for the purpose of guiding, directing warning or regulating traffic.
- **PARKING** - The standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading, or in obedience to an officer or traffic signs or signals, or while making emergency repairs or, if disabled, while arrangements are being made to remove such vehicle.
- **PARKING PERMIT** - A sticker use to authorize motor vehicle access to and use of the Cunningham Pond beach parking lot. Parking permits are valid for one year.
- **PEDESTRIAN** - Any person afoot.
- **PROHIBITED AREA** - Any part of the town where parking is prohibited.
- **RESTRICTED AREA** - Any part of the compact part of the town where parking is restricted.
- **ROADWAY** - That portion of a street or highway between the regularly established curblines or that part, exclusive of shoulders, improved and intended to be used for vehicular traffic.
- **SIDEWALK** - That portion of a street or highway set-aside for pedestrian travel.
- **STREET or HIGHWAY** - The entire width between property lines of every way open to the use of the public for purposes of travel.
- **TAXICAB** - Any rubber-tired vehicle having a manufacturer's rated capacity of not more than seven (7) passengers, used in the call and demand of transportation of passengers for compensation to or from points chosen or designated by the passengers and not operated on a fixed schedule, between fixed termini, or any such vehicle leased or rented or held for leasing or renting, with or without driver or operator.
- **TRAFFIC** - Pedestrians, animals (ridden or herded), vehicles or other conveyances either single or together while using any street or highway for the purpose of travel
- **VEHICLE** - Any mechanical device suitable for use on highways, except those propelled or drawn by human power or those used exclusively upon stationary tracks.

§ 195-2. Authority and duties of police.

- A. Officers to direct traffic. It shall be the duty of the Police Department to enforce the provisions of these regulations. The members of the Police Department are hereby authorized to direct all traffic either in person or by means of visible or audible signals in conformance with the provisions of these regulations, provided that in the event of a fire or other emergency to expedite traffic or safeguard pedestrians, officers of the Police or Fire Department may direct traffic, as conditions may require, notwithstanding the provisions of these regulations.

- B. Police may close streets temporarily. The Police Department is hereby authorized to close, temporarily, any street or highway in an impending or existing emergency or for any lawful assemblage, demonstration or procession, provided that there is reasonable justification for the closing of such street.
- C. Police may prohibit parking temporarily. The Police Department is hereby authorized to prohibit, temporarily, parking on any street or highway or part thereof in an impending or existing emergency or for a lawful assemblage, demonstration or procession, provided that there is reasonable justification for such prohibition. Vehicles parked in places where parking is prohibited temporarily may be moved by or under the direction of an officer.
- D. Exemptions. The provisions of these regulations shall not apply to operators actually engaged in work upon a street or highway closed to travel or under construction or repair, to officers when engaged in the performance of public duties nor to drivers of emergency vehicles while operating in an emergency, and in performance of public duties when the nature of the work of any of these necessitates the departure from any part of these regulations. These exemptions shall not, however, protect the driver of any vehicle from the consequences of a reckless disregard of the safety of others.

§ 195-3. Traffic signs, signals, directional signs, markings and zones.

- A. Display of unauthorized signs, signals and markings prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to place or maintain or to display upon or in view of any street any unofficial sign, signal, marking or device which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles an official traffic sign, signal, marking or device; or which attempts to direct the movement of traffic; or which hides from view any official sign or signal. The Police Department is hereby empowered to remove every such prohibited sign, signal, marking or device or cause it to be removed without notice.
- B. Upon request the Board of Selectmen may approve directional signs located in the Town right-of-way to services/activities that are not located upon the street where the sign is located.
- C. The sign shall not advertise any specific business, the purpose of the signs is to direct pedestrians and traffic to such places as municipal parking, food and stores.
- D. All direction signs shall be uniform in size, shape and color with a common logo.
- E. All directional signs are to be maintained by the applicant. Signs that are not maintained can be removed by the Board of Selectmen or their designee.

**ARTICLE II
Traffic Regulations**

§ 195-4. One-way streets.

- A. The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule 1 (§195-26) attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated.
- B. Violation of this section shall result in a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.)

§ 195-5. Vehicle weight limits.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any commercial vehicle or other tractor, trailer or tractor-trailer combination, having a gross weight in excess of that herein respectively prescribed, upon any of the streets or portions thereof described in Schedule II (§195-27), except for the purpose of making local deliveries on that street.
- B. Violation of this section shall result in a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.)

§ 195-6. Stop Intersections.

- A. The intersections described in Schedule III (§ 195-28), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as stop intersections. Stop signs shall be installed as provided therein.
- B. Violation of this section shall result in a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.)

**ARTICLE III
Parking Regulations**

§ 195-7. Definitions.

Whenever in this Article, the following terms are used, they shall have the meaning respectfully ascribed to them in this section:

- COMPACT PART OF THE TOWN - Includes Main Street, Depot Street, School Street, Vine Street, River Street, Winter Street, Vale Street, Bridge Street, Central Street, Laurel Street, Scott Street and Prospect Street; Cheney Avenue; Lookout Hill Road; Orchard Hill Road; Kaufman Drive; Nubanusit Lane; Grove Street to Noone's Mill; Granite Street to Wilton Road; Pine Street to Wilton Road; Concord Street to Sand Hill Road; Elm Street to Old Dublin Road; Union Street to west end of the playground; High Street to MacDowell Colony; Summer Street to Woodmere Apartments; Old Dublin
- Road to Elm Street; Route 202 South to south end of the Shopping Village; and Route 101 from Old Street Road westerly to Elm Street.
- PERSON - Any individual company, firm, corporation, association or other organization.
- PROHIBITED AREA - Any part of the town where parking is prohibited
- PUBLIC HIGHWAY – Any road, street, avenue, boulevard court, parking lot or way legally accepted for maintenance and dedicated public use by the legislative authority of the state and/or town, including those privately owned parking lots maintained for the use of customers.
- RESTRICTED AREA Any part of the compact part of town where parking is restricted.
- SIDEWALK - That portion of a street or highway set-aside for pedestrian travel.
- VEHICLE - Any mechanical device suitable for use on highways, except those propelled or drawn by human power or those used exclusively upon stationary tracks.

§ 195-8. Applicability of rules and regulations.

- A. The rules and regulations herein contained pertaining to control of vehicle parking shall apply to any person, company, firm, corporation, association or other organization.
- B. The Board of Selectmen of the Town of Peterborough may by resolution suspend the operation of these regulations or any portion thereof for temporary periods in cases of emergency, for public good or for other reasons which to it appears to justify such suspension.
- C. Nothing in these regulations shall affect any of the other ordinances of the Town of Peterborough with respect to its parking unless such sections are inconsistent with provisions of these regulations, in which case the sections and provisions of said other ordinances as may be in conflict are hereby repealed.
- D. The Chief of Police shall have the authority to establish or modify traffic patterns, establish parking areas, restrict parking or to modify the provisions of these regulations on a temporary basis. When such action is taken, the Chief of Police shall make ever reasonable effort to notify the general public of such action and shall notify the Chairman of the Peterborough Board of Selectmen.
- E. The penalty for violation of any of the provisions established under the authority of these regulations shall be as prescribed in RSA 105:8.
- F. In the interest of public safety, the Selectmen of the Town of Peterborough may restrict parking on any street within the town by having the area marked with appropriate signs. When this occurs, a notice will be placed in the newspaper of record for one issue.
- G. In the Public Interest and for the public safety, the speed limit downtown shall be 25 miles per hour. For the purpose of this alteration the downtown area will be comprised of the following Town Streets:
 - Main Street from Concord Street west to Union Street
 - Grove Street from Main Street to Intersection of Routes 101/202
 - School Street in its entirety
 - Depot Street in its entirety
 - Summer Street from Main Street to Woodmere Apartments
 - Vale Street in its entirety
 - River Street in its entirety
- H. In the interest of public safety and creating a safe environment for pedestrians, bicyclists, and horseback riders the following roads will have a speed limit of 25 miles per hour:
 - Old Jaffrey Road (**Added 08/05/2008**)

This modification of the speed limits is authorized under RSA 265:63.

§ 195-9. General parking prohibitions.

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any vehicle or any person having custody or control of any vehicle to park or permit the same to be parked in the following locations in the Town of Peterborough. Vehicles found parked in violation of the provisions of these regulations may be moved by or under the direction of a Town of Peterborough Police Officer and at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

- A. Within an intersection.
- B. Upon any sidewalk.
- C. Upon any crosswalk.
- D. Upon a roadway where parking is permitted unless both wheels on the right side of the vehicle are within twelve (12) inches of the curb or edge of the roadway, except those which are designated as one-way streets. On such one-way streets, a vehicle shall be parked parallel to the curb or edge of the roadway, in the direction of authorized traffic movement, with its right-hand wheels within twelve (12) inches of the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway or its left-hand wheels within twelve (12) inches of the left-hand curb or edge of the roadway. This shall not apply to streets or parts of streets where angle parking is required by these regulations.
- E. Upon any roadway where the parking of vehicles will not leave clear and unobstructed lane at least twelve (12) feet wide for passing traffic.
- F. Upon any street or highway within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant.
- G. Upon or in front of any private road or driveway.
- H. Upon any street or highway within ten (10) feet of an intersecting way, except alleys.
- I. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic.
- J. In such a manner as to obstruct any street or crossing for the purpose of taking on or allowing a person to alight or for loading or unloading, or for any other purpose, except in case of an accident or when directed to do so by a police officer.
- K. Handicap parking as provided by state law, RSA 265.69.
- L. Upon any public highway against the flow of traffic on that particular side of the highway.

195-10. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule IV (§195-29), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 195-11. Parking prohibited certain hours.

No person shall park a vehicle between the hours specified in Schedule V (§195-30) of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said Schedule V, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 195-12. Time limit parking.

No person shall park a vehicle for long~ than the time limit shown in Schedule VI (§195-31) at any time between the hours listed in said Schedule VI of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said Schedule VI, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 195-13. Angle parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule VII (§195-32) except at the angle designated and only within the painted stall lines. On all streets or portions thereof where angle parking is now or shall hereafter be authorized, all vehicles parked thereon shall be parked with the front thereof nearest the curb.

§ 195-14. Parallel parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets marked for parallel parking except within the painted stall lines when visible.

§ 195-15. Truck Traffic.

- A. Trucks, when unloading or loading shall not be considered as being parked. However, no trucks shall stop in the street to unload or load in such a manner as to prevent traffic from passing and repassing, and all unloading and loading operations shall be completed as expeditiously as possible.
- B. There shall be no through truck traffic allowed in the Downtown area including Main Street, Grove Street, Depot Street and School Street.

§ 195-16. Parking Lots

A. Daily Parking

School- Depot Street / Depot Park - No vehicle shall be left standing on the town owned School/Depot Street Parking Lot or Depot Park Parking Lot so called for more than twenty-four hours, pursuant to the provisions of Section 195-17 (section a).

B. Long-Term Parking

Summer Street Lot – No vehicle shall be left standing on the town owned Summer Street Lot so called for more than seventy-two hours, pursuant to the provisions noted in Section 195-17 (sections a & b).

C. Leased Parking Lot Spaces

Summer Street Lot – The Town may rent individual parking spaces to any individual who desires to rent same for a minimum period of one (1) month. All rentals shall be at a monthly rental rate of twenty (20) dollars. The number of permits issued shall not exceed (10) spaces. These permit rentals shall have no time limit and may remain around the clock seven (7) days a week, pursuant to the provisions noted in Section 195-17 (sections a & b).

D. Permit Parking

Cunningham Pond Beach parking lot—No vehicle shall be left standing or parked at the town owned Cunningham Pond Beach parking lot without a valid parking permit authorizing the use of said parking lot. Parking permits must be renewed annually which are only available through the Recreation Department. For each household, the first permit is free, subsequent household permits are available at \$5.00 per permit. Issued permits must be affixed to the lower passenger's side corner of the vehicle windshield so that it is visible from the outside.

Waiver

The above requirement may be waived or altered by the Board of Selectmen on a case by case basis due to hardship or special circumstances but only to the extent and for the time necessary to accommodate the applicant's special needs.

§ 195-17. Parking Lots- Provisions

- A. No unregistered or non-inspected vehicle shall be left standing or parked on any portion of any town owned parking lots.
- B. Summer Street Lot – Due to the long-term nature of the parking, maintenance of this area may be minimal; users will be responsible for dealing with snow banks and ice left by minimal snow plowing.

§ 195-18. Application For Leased Parking Permits

The application for a leased parking space permit shall contain the following information:

- Name of lessee
- Address
- Principle driver's license number
- Amount of time desired to lease

§ 195-19. Parking Lots- Violations

Any vehicle left parked and unattended in violation of this ordinance may be towed away at the expense of the owner.

§ 195-19.1 Penalties (amended by Selectmen July 1, 2008)

Cunningham Pond Beach parking lot—Vehicles left standing or parked at the Cunningham Pond beach parking lot, not displaying a valid parking permit, are subject to a \$25.00 parking ticket fine. Additionally, any vehicle left standing or parked that is blocking ingress or egress to the parking lot, other parked vehicles, walkway to the beach area or boat ramp area, are subject to a \$25.00 fine and/or towing at the registered owner's expense.

§ 195-20. Trucks in restricted area.

Trucks, when unloading or loading, shall not be considered as being parked. However, no trucks shall stop in the street to unload or load in such a manner as to prevent traffic from passing and repassing, and all unloading and loading operations shall be completed as expeditiously as possible.

§ 195-21. Winter parking.

- A. No person shall, between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 am. from the first day of November to the first

day of April, park or allow to be parked any motor vehicle on any street or sidewalk in the Town of Peterborough.

- B. The Chief of Police may, when deemed necessary because of weather conditions, suspend enforcement of this section upon giving notification of said suspension to the Chairman of the Town of Peterborough Board of Selectmen.
- C. Any vehicle which is parked on any public way and is interfering with municipal snow removal operations shall, after diligent attempts to locate the owner or operator thereof, be towed from its place and stored, the expenses of both to be paid by the owner of the vehicle before reacquiring the same.

§ 195-22. Police officer's report

- A. Any Town of Peterborough police officer observing a violation of these regulations may issue a parking ticket, the copy of which shall be considered his report of the violation, The report shall contain information as follows:
 - 1. The location where the vehicle was in violation of these regulations.
 - 2. The State license plate number of the vehicle in violation.
 - 3. The time and date said vehicle was parked in violation,
 - 4. Any other pertinent facts which are necessary for a thorough understanding of the circumstances of the violation.
- B. Upon completion of his report, the police officer shall attach to the vehicle in violation a notice (parking ticket) to the owner or operator that the vehicle is parking in violation and what the fine is (dollar amount) for this violation; and such notice shall instruct the owner or operator to mail or bring the ticket and payment to the Peterborough Tax Collector in full satisfaction of such violation within fourteen (14) days of such violation,
- C. If the fine is not paid within fourteen (14) days, the initial fine shall double. The Chief of Police shall send a reminder notice of the violation to the owner of the vehicle instructing the owner that he may avoid further action or prosecution by paying the total amount to the Town of Peterborough Tax Collector within five (5) days.
- D. If payment is not received within five (5) days, a court complaint will be issued and the fine will double again.

**ARTICLE IV
Miscellaneous Provisions**

§ 195-23. Severability.

The provisions of these regulations are severable, and if any clause, sentence, section or part thereof shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, such judgment or decision shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation and application to the clause, sentence, section or part thereof rendered. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board of Selectmen that these regulations would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional clause, sentence, section or part thereof had not been included therein.

§ 195-24. Repealer.

All ordinances or regulations or parts of ordinances or regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

§ 195-25. When Effective.

These regulations shall take effect as provided by law.

**ARTICLE V
Schedules**

§ 195-26. Schedule 1: One-Way Streets.

In accordance with the provisions of §195-4A, the following described streets or parts of streets are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated:

§ 195-27. Schedule II: Vehicle Weight Limits.

In accordance with the provisions of §195-5A gross weight limits are established as indicated for commercial vehicles or other tractor., trailer, or tractor-trailer combinations upon the streets or portions thereof described below, except as provided in §195-5A.

§ 195-29. Schedule IV: Parking Prohibited at All Times.
